SKYE SINGLETON

Skye Singleton, Oklahoma native, has received the Marilyn Horne and Dame Eva Turner awards. KUCO's review of her portrayal as the tragic heroine, Lucia, hailed her as "magnificent" with "high D's that topped the ensemble..." Her operatic roles include: Lucia (*Lucia di Lammermoor*), Queen Shemaka (*The Golden Cockerel*), Norina (*Don Pasquale*), Dido (*Dido and Aeneas*), Galatea (*Acis and Galatea*), and Frasquita (*Carmen*). She sings with Painted Sky Opera as an educational outreach singer. In Austria, Skye sang Madame Herz from Mozart's *Die Schauspieldirektor* in scenes at the Tyrolean Opera Program.

An avid concert soloist, Skye adores singing Handel's *Messiah* with previous engagements at both the Bartlesville Choral Society and the Norman Philharmonic. Skye also specializes in contemporary works. She had the pleasure to work with Michael Daugherty in the Oklahoma premiere of his "Labyrinth of Love" with the OU Wind Symphony (2017). Other works include: George Crumb's "Apparition" in collaboration with Dr. Elizabeth Avery (2019); premiering the title role of the new short opera Yisem for OKC's Opera on *Tap* (2019); working with Nikki Krumweide on her soundtrack "*Whispers*" for "*The Vexation of Spirit*" Student Documentary by Dylan Larino; premiering Krumwiede's song cycle "*Songs of the Sea*" (2020); and premiering an excerpt of Evan Hargraves's "*Diurnal Musings*" (song cycle for Soprano and String Quartet- 2021). Upcoming, she'll premiere Jacob Frost's *How Can I Keep from Singing* in Opera on Tap's 10 Minute Opera Festival (2022).




KATHRYN STEWART

Contralto Kathryn Stewart grew up in Bartlesville, where she studied piano with Martha Boucher, and oboe with Mort Cuplin. She studied music at the Univ. of Oklahoma and the Univ. of Tulsa, where she graduated with a degree in vocal/instrumental music education. She then accepted a scholarship to Yale Univ., where she received her MM in vocal performance. She then moved to Los Angeles, where she sang regularly with the L.A. Opera, and other companies. She toured nationally with Opera Ala Carte which specialized in the repertoire of Gilbert and Sullivan, performing many of the young mezzo roles including, Pitti-Sing (*The Mikado*), Kate (*The Pirates of Penzance*), Hebe (*HMS Pinafore*), and Tessa (*The Gondoliers*). She also toured internationally as an Allied Concert Artist. Kathryn has

performed the title role in "Carmen", Berta in "The Barber of Seville", Prince Orlofsky in "Die Fledermaus", and many others. She has also performed with many symphonies and chorales, including the L.A. Philharmonic, The L.A. Master Chorale, the Phoenix Symphony, the Cambridge SIngers, singing the alto solos in such notable works as The St. Matthew Passion, St. John Passion, B minor Mass, and Christmas Oratorio by J.S. Bach, Requiem by Mozart, Elijah by Mendelssohn, Requiem by Durufle, King David by Honneger, and many others. Locally Kathryn has performed with the Bartlesville Choral Society and Bartlesville Symphony, the Signature Symphony, Tulsa Chorale, and Tulsa Opera. One of her best experiences was getting to sing back-up to The Three Tenors in Dodger Stadium, which was aired live on PBS.

Kathryn happily moved back to Oklahoma in 1995, and she and her husband welcomed their daughter, Megan, a year later. Kathryn still remains active in the musical community of NE OK, and is blessed to be the Director of Music at First Presbyterian Church of Bartlesville, where she inflicts her limited pipe organ skills on the extremely tolerant choir and congregation. She offers a big THANK YOU to Susan Mueller and the Choral Society for this opportunity to participate in the performance today.





JEFFREY PICÓN

Jeffrey Picón, tenor, has performed in opera houses and with major symphonies across the United States. He has performed with New York City Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, San Francisco Opera, Cleveland Orchestra, the Israel Philharmonic, the Naples Philharmonic, the Oregon Bach Festival, the Rochester Philharmonic, Long Island Symphony Orchestra, Lyric Opera of Kansas City, Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Dallas Opera, Pittsburgh Opera, Arizona Opera, and the Opera Company of Philadelphia. He is a graduate of The University of North Texas and The Curtis Institute of Music. Mr. Picón is an Assistant Professor of Voice and Diction for the Wanda L. Bass School of Music at Oklahoma City University.

ANDRÉ CHIANG

Baritone André Chiang was described as "vocally commanding" (*Oregonian*), "handsome of voice" (*Opera News*), and lauded with "let's hear more from this singer" (*Washington Post*). Chiang's recent engagements include Masetto (*Don Giovanni*) and Dandini (*La cenerentola*) with Dayton Opera, The Pirate King (*The Pirates of Penzance*) with Tulane Summer Lyric Theatre, Older Thompson (*Glory Denied*) with Painted Sky Opera, and Schaunard (*La bohème*) with Mississippi Opera and Mobile Opera. Previous credits include Young Galileo/Salviati (*Galileo Galilei*), for which he was commercially recorded, Argante (*Rinaldo*), and Ford (*Falstaff*) with Portland Opera; Anthony Hope (*Sweeney Todd*) with Virginia Opera; and Lancelot in

the Young Artist Matinee of Camelot at the Glimmerglass Festival.

Competition honors include Regional Finalist for the MONC (Metropolitan Opera National Council) Auditions, Winner of the 59th NFMC (National Federation of Music Clubs) 2017 Biennial Young Artist Award, and Winner of the 45th NATS (National Association of Teachers of Singing) Artist Awards Competition. In concert, Chiang performed as the Baritone soloist in *Carmina Burana* with the Symphony Chorus of New Orleans, Huntsville Symphony, Baton Rouge Symphony, and Canterbury Voices; and the Baritone Soloist in Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony* with the Richmond Symphony. His Stern Auditorium at Carnegie Hall debut came as the Baritone soloist in the World Premiere of Martin Palmeri's Gran Misa. Upcoming engagements include Baritone soloist with the Canterbury Voices "Duo Lumina" concert, and Silvio (*Pagliacci*) with Painted Sky Opera.

Chiang received his Bachelor of Music from the University of South Alabama, Master of Music from the Manhattan School of Music, and Doctor of Musical Arts from Louisiana State University. As an educator, Chiang was a 2018 NATS Intern and is an Assistant Professor of Music – Voice at Oklahoma State University. He attended the Contemporary Commercial Institute at Shenandoah Conservatory in 2018 and also attained the designation of a "National Center for Voice and Speech trained Vocologist" in 2019 at the Summer Vocology Institute. Chiang was featured as a presenter and panelist at the 2020 NATS National Conference and serves as the Artistic Director of Opera NexGen. He also maintains a private studio teaching all styles of singing. www.andrechiangbaritone.com
